All patients were requested to come to the centre a night before. In total 47 patients came to avail this unique opportunity of having a free treatment for their eyes. Most of them being old and frail, escorted by a family member.

On arrival, a delicious dinner and a warm comfortable bed were welcoming them. There was a real buzz of excitement and anticipation in the air.

The patients and their escorts enjoyed to sleep on new mattresses and pillows donated by Mr Suraj Chandalia of the VITA FOAM MATTRESSES.

Of the total of 47 who came for the camp, 20 qualified for cataract surgery. Out of these 20, 17 had unilateral cataracts and 3 were diagnosed with bilateral dense cataracts meaning they were totally blind. Others had various ocular pathologies for which they were counseled and/or given medications, or provided with corrective glasses. One teenage kid had injured his eye with a stick and was diagnosed with corneal laceration. He was admitted for surgery and the wound was sutured.

Dr Mustafa, our camp ophthalmologist, and his team performed 18 surgeries on the first day of the camp and 5 the next day. We had the opportunity to avail the services of Dr Ali Hassan, an ophthalmologist from UK at this camp. Post op evaluation for all were conducted the following day. All patients were provided with details on the after-care and a pictorial info sheet explaining the Do's and Don'ts. Free eye drops, sun glasses and pain killers were also provided. Thankfully, this time there were no frequent power interruptions and the surgeries were conducted very peacefully.


All the patients and their families were very happy with the hospitality and care they received at the Centre. The guests were provided with breakfast, mid morning porridge, lunch, mid afternoon tea, dinner and evening tea during their 2 days stay at the centre.

One week follow-up checking was conducted by Dr Ali Hassan. The excitement, joy, prayers and appreciation for the gift of life was to be seen. Some had gained sight after a couple of years of almost total blindness. They could not contain their happiness of getting a new life, free from being dependent on others for basic daily chores. One lady was so excited that she insisted on climbing the stairs and walking to the clinic alone without any escort – after all, she could finally SEE!

The final monthly follow-up check up will take place on 21st and 28th September.


